STERLING #1

"All Kairos weekends are wonderful, but this Kairos is wonnnderful!" With that, Rector Wayne Park began the Closing for Kairos #1 in the Northwest Quadrant of Sterling Correctional Facility, 6 May 2001.

About 100 outside visitors attended the Closing, some travelling 200 miles each way. Most were from northern Colorado, as were most of the team members. For months ahead of time, the organizing team did lots and lots of promotion. The Lord responded by doing His part. Result: strong community support.

Warden Furlong and his staff were also very supportive all along. He had experienced Kairos in 1983 in the beginning days of Colorado Kairos in the Fremont Correctional Facility. He was pleased to report to the Closing that this Kairos more than confirmed his recollection of the many benefits of the program, including to the facility staff. Then he said, "To those of you on a Kairos team for the first time, I trust you are more complete Christians than you were five days ago."

Programs Director Mike Ehrmann also addressed the Closing, speaking very enthusiastically about the Weekend and citing its effect on his staff as well as the obvious effect on the residents sitting there behind him. From his remarks and those of many of the residents at open mike, it became very apparent that during the Weekend there had been a significant healing between residents and staff — or, as one resident put it later, between the green shirts and the blue. This happened most deeply at the Forgiveness Windup on Saturday night. Many Kleenex moments.

At the closing there was a lot of sharing of personal brokenness — at open mike time and then in the Fourth Day Talk by a resident who had made his Kairos at Fremont. "In 1997 Jesus Christ broke my heart. An outside team member told me that God was going to use me mightily. But that meant dying to myself mightily. My wife prayed for me. On my Kairos, Jesus Christ broke my heart again. I didn't know no fear until I ran into Jesus Christ. He is still breaking my heart today."

Kairos of Colorado wants all of you to know how much we appreciate your very solid support of this new program. Wayne is especially grateful, and we commend him for his answering God's call to organize and lead it all. We are also grateful to George Wakefield, President of the Kairos National Board, who served as one of the table leaders.

CLOSING COMMENTS

I haven't seen this much color in clothes in a long time.

I'm taking back my life that Satan took from me.

Before Kairos I thought "What can Kairos teach me." I was hypocritical, without hope, with a hard heart because I thought I knew it all. Now I have the ability to show compassion, to listen more. I have the conviction of hate and prejudice, and a new set of eyes toward all people, including the blue shirts.

I've been on highs, I've been on lows. In prison I found the Grand Canyon. Now I've found the Way out of it.

I arrived a triple lifer, drained of all hope. Now I know something very important: there may be someone yet unborn who will someday come through these doors, and it is my job to be there to minister to him

There has been transformation for us, yes — but also for those who came in, and for the staff.

I arrived with a lot of prejudice, Like "I'd better sit with the white brothers." I immediately became a minority. I found that most of my hate comes from within myself, so I put myself on the forgiveness list. I gave it all up to the Lord. Then I found out last night that my parole plan was working out.

Through Kairos the Lord opened the doorway and gave us a glimpse of what heaven is like. Through the outside brothers God penetrated my heart.

Why does a grown man cry? Because you loved me.

RECENT CLOSINGS

DELTA #19

I've been praying for a long time now for God to show me how to let Jesus in. That prayer was answered this weekend.

The 3 days changed everything for me. I am not alone!

I came a gang banger, leave a gang member for God.

I found a family that can't be taken away.

I've got hope again, a jump start to continue with life.

Even though I'm in prison, I take away the knowledge that I'm free and loved.

I found the missing piece to the puzzle.

When I was sentenced to DOC I had no idea this was a part of the punishment. They say the road to heaven is narrow; they had better widen it because now there are 43 more of us on it!

I was loved by total strangers when I didn't think I was worthy of someone else to love me. It was hard for me to love others (other candidates) even here in the chapel, but now out there I'll show you love regardless.

I thought there was nothing special here for me. I was depressed, felt like part of the walls here. But Saturday night I found simplicity after I left. This brought me deeper with God. He's changing me and I need to let Him. We're human in here, still breathing, and God has something for us here.

This is the first time I finished something in my whole life. My spirit was very disturbed, I couldn't finish anything. I prayed with a spiritual counselor, got filled with the Holy spirit. Now I've got the power to believe God answers prayers.

I was confused and had lots of anger. I thought nobody could get through my wall. But God found a crack and helped me start tearing it down.

I was running from the Lord. Now I'm brought back. A seed of love dropped into a crack in my heart and I'm going to nurture it. I almost bolted when I got those letters 'cause I felt I wasn't worthy. But I found out I am worth it.

I recently told the Lord I wanted to go home and be with Him and my mom — I wanted to die. Then He gave me Kairos. Now I am home, and have a grandma and several moms and even a dad. This has been heaven to me.

The letters from overseas were awesome!

We arrived hungry, hungry for God. We started eating. Eating makes you warm inside, leads to fellowship. Found we need to eat spiritual food.

I knew the Bible better than most of you, but God showed me that there's a lot more to being a Christian than that — that I need Christian fellowship.

Kairos is a way to come to Jesus, a way to open the door to your heart.

I have about two months to live. I go back to the hospice tomorrow. You don't realize how much love there is here in this place.

I used to make fun of Christians due to their "superior" attitudes. There were lots of conflicts. Now I've found people in the world who care for me. I'm not going back to my old ways, even though my buddies want me to.

I fell away from the church because they were mean to me every time. Now I have a new relationship with God. I got on my knees and prayed to God to take away the spirit of homosexuality from me.

This morning at ten o'clock I accepted Christ in my heart. When I came back into the room everything was so clear and bright to me. I'm going to tell everybody about Jesus.

It takes more than a prison to break a tough guy.
