### SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING ----

In times of stress -- in times of trials and tribulations -- we often get the feeling that the Lord has deserted us. These Feelings are natural and very normal. Of course we a know that the Lord hasn't deserted us, but the feelings are real and very much a part of us at the same time.

So how do we get past feelings like this? How do we avoid the sometimes helpless and hopeless feelings that often accompany situations like this? We know we should pray and spend time communicating with God, but even that can be difficult. So what's the answer?

That's where ministries such as Kairos have a lot to offer their people. When we can't seem to pray for ourselves, there are others that are ready to pick up that prayer burden for us. This seems to hapen even when we don't make our needs known. Just think then, how much stronger the prayers would be and how much stronger we could be if we really did share our needs.

Isn't that what our Share and Prayer Groups are all about? We are all familiar with the fact that Jesus told us that when two or three are gathered together in His name He is there in the midst of them. The likelihood of all members of a group feeling depressed and deserted at the same time would be pretty rare. Actually, there is a much greater chance of all members of the group feeling good and positive at the same time. When someone has the experience of Jesus being real, vital, and ever present in their life, they have a tendency to want to share this with others. If the others present are close friends and fellow Christians, such as you find with a small Share and Prayer Group, they are usually much more open to receiving and experiencing Jesus for themselves.

Whether it's an inmate looking forward to spending the rest of his or her life in prison, or a person on the street who will never see the inside of a prison, their need is the same -- What they need is Jesus, there is no better way to experience Jesus than through a friend we can trust.

How about you? Are you supporting others -- and being supported -- in a small Share and Prayer Group?

### A CLOSING VISITOR---

--- Excerpts from a Bishop's column

"On a recent wet Sunday afternoon I sat in the congregation listening to the inmates as they told their stories about the power of Christ in their lives and the power of community and love and friendship. So many of them had experienced a society that had rejected them, not only because of what they had done, but for many it seemed because of who they were as people. To spend time with a community that cared for them as they were cared for by the Kairos Community was transforming in and of itself.

"Surrounded by the walls of a prison this past Sunday evening I experienced the power of Christian community. I experienced the reality that Christ's resurrection can happen both in individual lives and in communities -- that the love that is offered in the most unlikely of environments can bring honesty, depth, commitment, acceptance, joy. In that place a week after Easter Day I could see that Christ was risen in some of the inmates who saw themselves as society's rejects. I could see that Christ lives in the young inmate who walked out with us and thanked us for the time we had spent (in prayer support and in coming to the Closing). It demonstrated to me once again the power of the Resurrection Community.

"I spend my time travelling around this diocese sharing and participating for short periods of time in so many different ministries. I often leave visits to many communities inspired and lifted up. It is important in this column to tell of one such occasion that occurred on a rainy Sunday evening."

PROJECT: CHAPEL at COLORADO WOMEN'S CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

Thank you very much for your generous support of this special project. Your tax deductible gift of \$ , received in 1990, greatly assists us in paying the \$32,500 cost of the modular Chapel building we placed at Colorado Women's Correctional Facility in Canon City in July 1988. Since then the Chapel has provided space for regular Sunday worship, Chaplain's offices, some weekday classes, 5 Kairos Weekends, 5 Kairos Retreats, and 3 Prison Fellowship Seminars.

Please ask your church, church groups, and friends to help this cause, too. Then we can complete repayment our \$23,500 no-interest loan, for which we still need about \$6,500. We will keep you informed through our Progress Reports, so you can continue to rejoice with us for God's provision for His children, including those behind bars.

Again, in Christ's name, we thank you!
