# "WHOEVER WANTS TO BE GREAT..." (Matthew 20:26-28)

The Lord never ceases to amaze me when He grants me the privilege of serving Him in new ways. I was blessed to be asked to serve as the Advising Rectora for Hilltop Kairos #1 (first women's weekend) in Gatesville, Texas. What an awesome experience. Some would say that their Cursillo, Walk to Emmaus, etc., was their "mountain top" experience. Although my Cursillo was special, and I've had many since my walk with Jesus began, I must say that my weekend in Texas was that #1 "mountain top" for me. God's presence and love embraced me from the time I boarded the plane to Dallas through my return trip to Denver. This came through others who shared His love with me, and then His placing others in my path to share that same love with them.

You may be wondering what this all has to do with the title of this article. As a member of the Colorado and National Boards, I am called upon at times to address difficult circumstances locally and nationally. Consequently, recently Satan seems to be working overtime to cause division and strife throughout this ministry, using those of us who have been around for awhile. I believe our focus may need some clarification.

I reflect on the greatest leader who ever was, Jesus. I do not recall at anytime when LOVE did not motivate His actions, and that He was always willing to step aside and take the servant's role. I would like to ask each of us to step back, pray, and again commit ourselves to being servants of the Lord and all those whom He brings into each of our lives.

The cadidates on Hilltop #1 taught me a wonderful lesson in servanthood. Because of a Kairos volunteer not following rules, these women were forced to submit to a strip search. Throughout this humiliating experience these women not only were encouraging us, but weeping and praying for us. That, to me, is not only servanthood, but a true demonstration of God's love.

Lord Jesus, help us to stop... and come back to being servants. Remind us, in all circumstances, to pray, "What would You (Jesus) do?", before we say or do anything.

INSIDE JOB is an inspirational journal written by inmates and distributed by a dedicated outside volunteer. The following is an excerpt from the June 1994 issue:

"Am I an overcomer??...or Am I being overcome???

"In the Church there are two classes of believers: the overcomers and overcome. The overcomers are those who satisfy God's original thought. From the letters to the seven churches found in Revelation chapters 2 and 3. it is evident that the LORD is now calling for overcomers. Though He has not forsaken the overcome, His eyes are nevertheless upon that company of overcomers who will fulfill His original thought.

" What is God's original thought concerning the Church?? The original thought of God concerning the Church is that she might be the 'residue of Christ' of 'the fullness of Christ'. ## FREMONT REPORT

The Fremont Advisory Council met in Elizabeth on Saturday, April 16th. They nominated six Fremont team members for addition to the Observing Rectors pool: Norm Fritzler, Darek Johnson, Lynn Kirschner, Terry Kruse, Curtis McAllister, and Abram Sandoval. The Board of Directors approved all six at their June 2nd meeting, so the AC can call upon any of these men to be Observing Rector at future Kairos weekends, depending on their availabilities at the time.

For Fremont #24 in September, Dan Halperin is serving as OR, with Dave Tillack as Rector and Denny Shea as Advising Rector. The AC decided to ask the Board for permission for each AC to set its own team fee amounts. On June 2nd, the Board approved that, too.

As for storage facilities, the AC is in the process of arranging for a separate "shed" in Cañon City. It should be ready for use sometime this Fall. Fremont will gradually build up its own equipment, but still use some of the common equipment until all Fremont items are in place.

A two-day Retreat was held on June 11 and 12 with excellent participation by residents and team members.

As this newsletter goes to press, team meetings have already started for Fremont #24. We cannot overemphasize the importance of attendance at the team meetings. That is how we become the obviously loving, bonded, and unified Body of Christ for the immates we serve on each Kairos.

#### WOMEN'S REPORT

Our two-day Retreat was held July 15-16 and we ask for your prayers for all of the participants. "Walking the walk" is so difficult "inside", and those women need all the support we can give them.

Team formation is under way for Kairos #23, October 13-16, with Lorraine Lovato as the Rectora. The Board has approved the Advisory Council's recommendation to have two Observing Rectoras this time: Susan Garcia and Laurie Wells.

The Closing will be on October 16 and all attendees must complete and turn in new Temporary Volunteer forms by late August. Please contact me or a current team member to get a form. Please be praying for the team leaders and all of the team members and candidates that the Lord is calling for this particular "God's Special Time".

Due to constraints of time and postage expense, it is not our practice to send separate 'Thank you' notes or Receipts except for single donations of \$250 or more, as required by current IRS rules. We pray you will accept this general 'THANK YOU' which we extend to all of our supporters. Our current estimated annual budget is \$40,000, so you can see how valuable every donation of any size is to us.

Please remember that we now keep track of income and expenditures for each prison ministry group and the District Board separately. Undesignated donations are automatically credited to the District Board.

My favorite scripture relating to financial support for God's work in this world is in 2 Corinthians 9:5-15. I really don't believe I can express the gratitude of the Kairos prison ministry any better than St. Paul does in this passage, portions of which I will quote here:

".... and it will show that you give because you want to, not because you have to. .... Each one should give, then, as he has decided, not with regret or out of a sense of duty; for God loves the one who gives gladly. And God is able to give you more than you need, so that you will always have all you need for yourselves and more than enough for every good cause. .... And God, who supplies seed for the sower and bread to eat, will also supply you with all the seed you need and make it grow and produce a rich harvest from your generosity. He will always make you rich enough to be generous at all times, so that many will thank God for your gifts which they receive from us. For this service you perform not only meets the needs of God's people, but also produces an outpouring of gratitude to God. And because of the proof which this service of yours brings, many will give glory to God ..... for your generosity in sharing with them and everyone else. And so with deep affection they will pray for you because of the extraordinary grace God has shown you. Let us thank God for his priceless gift." This experience can release us from our own prisons. We shed tears of joy, thanksgiving, washing away the wreckage of the past.

I just lost my wife and haven't been able to let her rest. I have 2 daughters, 4 and 10. It's been hard to deal with all this. This weekend, I let her come to rest. I know she is in our Lord's hands, and soon I'll be there to see the beautiful smile she had.

I came to Kairos for the word. I learned to forgive as Jesus forgives us. I'm leaving with renewed faith in Jesus.

If this is what heaven is about, we all want one-way tickets.

We came very wounded spiritually. You had an outpouring of love to give us.

I was so far under the ground I was about clear to China. I found kindness and love here.

I was touched by the people that shared with us their hurts out there.

Jesus is spreading through me. We don't have to be prisoners in our hearts.

I don't have to look behind me because all of you are walking beside me.

It ain't cool to have feelings. Now we got tears of jov.

Three months ago I was a Satan worshipper -- I found Jesus.

This isn't jail house religion. It's a stepping stone for my life.

Showing your love to us took that shield off me.

We know now we can go to the Kairos Brothers and pray with them.

Now we can get out and not return, as we have found Jesus Christ.
