

COLORADO KAIROS HISTORY

1982 God led Bill Potter and the St Francis Episcopal Cursillo Ultreya group in Colorado Springs to pray about starting a prison ministry in Colorado. DOC pointed Bill toward CWCF, which put Bill in touch with a CWCF lay volunteer named Bill Fay, who had been praying since January for someone with the organizational skills to launch a "Cursillo" program in the Colorado prisons. The two Bills connected. Bill Potter already knew about Kairos, so he then connected with Kairos National in Florida and observed a Kairos there. With a group of Front Range Catholic and Episcopal Cursillo and Koinonia communities, he organized a Kairos Secretariat with:

1985 June 14: Incorporated a board of directors as "Kairos of Colorado, Inc" with purpose of raising and managing the funds for Kairos in Colorado. The original seven directors were:

October 22: Merged the functions of the Colorado Secretariat into the Board of Directors of "Kairos of Colorado, Inc."

1987 January 4: Began Ultreyas at Skyline CF. Coordinator: Jim Strub.

July 11-12: Kairos Weekend for CTCF Special Management Group (HIV/AIDS): Rector: Bob Sears

August 6-8: Colorado Kairos hosted International Kairos Summer Conference at Falcon Inn, Monument CO, Administrator: Ralph Browning.

November 7-8: Skyline 2-day Retreat. Retreat Leader: Jim Strub

1988 July 28: dedicated new CWCF Chapel Building provided by the "Kairos Prison Chapel Fund," chaired by Peggy Strub.

1989 January 7-8: Skyline 2-day Retreat. Retreat Leader: Bob St Clair

October 26-29 Colorado Walk to Emmaus #1, Tempel Hills Retreat Center, Woodland Park. Core team from Oklahoma, with team fleshed out with many Colorado Kairos team members.

December 17: Began Ultreyas at Arkansas Valley CF (Ordway). Coordinator: Dave Jones (later: Bob Shields)

1991 February 26: Skyline program terminated due to October 1990 population restructuring.

April 27-28: Arkansas Valley 2-day Retreat. Retreat Leader: Jim Strub

1992 January 30 - February 2: DELTA KAIROS #1

Rector: Andrew Kaminski
 Coordinator (later: Facility Liaison): Andrew Kaminski (later: Danny Ramirez, Darrell Corlett, Bill Bennett, Allen Molendyk, Bill Bennett)

1993 January 12: Colorado District Board initiated formation of facility Advisory Councils.

February 21: Began Ultreyas at Limon CF. Interim Coordinator: Jim Saunders

March 16: Abandoned Arkansas Valley program (lack of outside team members)

1994 February 10: Abandoned Limon program (no coordinator, no resident chaplain)

1996 July 17-21: Colorado Kairos hosted International Kairos Summer Conference at Snow Mountain Ranch, Granby CO. Administrator: Mary Sogan.

2001 March 18: Began Monthly Reunions at Denver Women's CF. Coordinator: Mary Sogan

May 3-6: STERLING (NORTH) KAIROS #1

Rector: Wayne Park
 Coordinator: Wayne Park.
 Subsequent Sterling Coordinators (later: Facility Liaison): Andrew Sisneros, Tom Sonntag, Terry Bessler, Randy Borden, Mark Cook, Bernie Devault, Paul Benevides.

2002 June 6-9: STERLING SOUTH KAIROS #1

Rector: Ron Fullmer

September 28: 20th Anniversary Celebration. About 100 Kairos people, including former inmates, gathered in Frisco to celebrate 20 years of God's blessing of this ministry in Colorado.

December 5-8: DENVER WOMEN'S KAIROS #1

Rectora: Jean Mares
 Coordinator (later: Facility Liaison): Gabriella Ramirez (later: Jean Mares, Teddy DeBerry, Liz Castillo)

2003 February: "Kairos of Colorado, Inc" became a State Chapter of "Kairos Prison Ministry International, Inc." (KPMI), as part of a Kairos-wide reorganization providing more standardization and financial accountability.

July 17-20: LIMON KAIROS #1

Rector: Jim Richardson
 Coordinator (later: Facility Liaison): Dick Evans (later: Jim Fitzpatrick, Dick Evans)

2004 October 17: Began Monthly Reunions at Brush Women's CF. Facility Liaison: Jan Loesch

2005 March 3-6: STERLING EAST KAIROS #1

Leader: Mike Braden

June 2-5: BRUSH KAIROS #1

Leader: Mary Lou Hernandez
 Facility Liaison: Jan Loesch (later: Chris Bauer, Karen Salzman)

July 1: Effective date of a six-month suspension of Kairos at Fremont. There had been a security violation on 11-12 June. As a result of this and other violations occurring at Kairos prisons, the state organization undertook a major review of security and issued more stringent security guidelines for use in all our Colorado facilities. (Later: in early 2007 the State Committee formally established a position of Security Coordinator, and appointed Jean Yancheck to that position.)

August 4-7: RIFLE KAIROS #1

Leader: Skaught Graham
 Facility Liaison: Roger Quarry (later: Scott Graham, Tyne Bush)

November: Sterling administration requested each of the three Kairos programs to cut back from two 4-day weekends per year to one, due to administrative overload caused by hosting six Sterling weekends per year.

2006 February 5: Monthly Reunions resumed at Fremont.

June 3-4: 2-day Retreats resumed at Fremont.

November: State Committee established Ad hoc committee for Kairos Outside, a ministry to the female loved ones of the incarcerated. Chair: Jean Mares

2007 April-May: Cornell Companies, Inc, purchased Brush Women's CF from GRW Inc, changed name to High Plains CF. Kairos Weekend numbering remained intact, so first 4-day as "High Plains" was Kairos #4.

April 13: began monthly "Street Gatherings" in Denver at Grant Avenue UMC (later: Warren UMC), 2nd Fridays. Coordinator: Mary Sogan (later: Glenda Condon)

June 2: established Colorado Kairos Web Site (www.kairoscolorado.org). Webmaster: Jeff Holley (later: Ryan Cline, Don Bates). In early 2015 Susan Despotopulos redesigned the website and established it at www.kairosofcolorado.org.

December: final USPS edition of the Colorado Kairos Newsletter. Subsequent publication by email only.

2008 February 15-18: first 4-day Kairos at Fremont since suspension (#46, Leader: Bruce Carlson)

August: Program at High Plains (formerly Brush) suspended after security violations during High Plains #5.

November 14-16: Colorado Kairos Outside #1 (Estes Park). Leader: Jean Mares

November 21: began monthly "Street Gatherings" in Colorado Springs at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, 3rd Fridays. Coordinator: Jean Magnuson.

2009 June 4: Cañon Women's Correctional Facility decommissioned. Inmates moved to either La Vista CF (Pueblo), Denver Women's CF, or High Plains CF (Brush). The CWCF Kairos team turned their attention to establishing Kairos at the La Vista CF in Pueblo.

September 3: began biweekly Kairos mini-reunions at La Vista CF. Facility Liaison: Sara Igyarto

November 5-8: STERLING WEST KAIROS #26

Sterling North (actually northwest) had had 13 weekends, Sterling South (actually southwest) had had 12 – a total of 25 Kairos weekends. At this point they were combined into "West," and thus #26.

2010 May 6: began Sunday evening Monthly Reunions at La Vista CF.

June 6: Began Monthly Reunions at Hudson CF (an Alaska DOC facility), Facility Liaison: Peter Kufeke

June 30: High Plains CF closes.

2011 January 8,9: Hudson Retreat #1. Leader: Randy Borden

June 19: Final (at least for now) Fremont Monthly Reunion, after 28 years in that facility. The last 4-day was #28 in February 2010.

October 20-23: HUDSON KAIROS #1

Leader: Steve Manzanares
 Facility Liaison: Peter Kufeke

2012 March: The formal Kairos Program at Limon was abandoned due to frequent lockdowns and other disruptions associated with Security Levels 4 and 5. The team members continued their ministry as "Ekklesia Prison Ministries" in the context of what the prison circumstances would allow.

2015 October 1-4: BENT COUNTY KAIROS #1

 Facility Liaison: Russ Gorrell (later: Tom Blair)

2016 September 29–October 2: BUENA VISTA KAIROS #1

Leader: Roger Hilbig

October 2 – Rifle Kairos program disestablished after conclusion of Kairos #23.

October 20-23: LA VISTA KAIROS #1

Leader: Ann Weida
 Facility Liaison: Sara Igyarto (later: Ann Weida)

Note: As time went on, "Rector/Rectora" changed to "Leader," state "President" changed to "Chairperson," and our local use of "Coordinator" changed to "Facility Liaison."
